We are a vibrant, conservative evangelical, Anglican church with a lively, Christian community in Sevenoaks, Kent. We seek to honour God and make disciples of Jesus and we believe that the Bible and prayer are essential to these tasks.

There are 5 Sunday services and many community and outreach events taking place during the week. Our structure includes 4 congregations with an average overall attendance of around 500 adults and 140 children. (We are still a little below pre-covid numbers of 570 adults and 200 children.)

We have a wonderful, experienced staff of 15 full and part-time employees.

We have a large and growing number of young families and wish to appoint a full time Children and Families' Minister to serve in this vital area of ministry.

Role Description

- To oversee the children's ministry (for ages 0-11yrs) throughout the year in a variety of settings, to enable children to know Christ and start to grow as Christ's disciples.
- To develop, train and lead a team of volunteers in this area of service who can teach God's Word to children with passion and conviction.
- To develop a wider ministry amongst families particularly at the StNics@9.15 and StNics@11 congregations and in the wider community to enable them to be brought to Christ and grow in maturity in Christ.

Main responsibilities

- To lead, organise and develop the children's groups at our Sunday morning services which take place in the church building, in collaboration with the Children & Women's Minister for the StNics@LadyBoswell's congregation which meets offsite.
- To support, encourage, train and equip staff and volunteers in delivering children's ministry,
- To work alongside parents, who have the primary responsibility for nurturing their children in the Christian faith, offering support and encouragement as appropriate.
- To organise regular training in-house and externally as necessary.
- To develop midweek ministry eg. to parents with pre-school children, to school children in after school clubs etc
- To develop and promote evangelism among children, including (but not

- limited to) an Annual Holiday Club, after school activities and through building links with our local schools, leading regular school assemblies.
- As a Licenced Children's Minister within the Diocese, to ensure that good health and safety and safeguarding practices and policies are embedded in the children's work.

Person Specification

A committed Christian with an obvious love for Jesus and for children. Someone with

- a desire to see children become disciples of Jesus
- the conviction that teaching the Bible is central to making disciples
- experience of leading children's ministry
- excellent interpersonal and communication skills in order both to teach as well as to train others

Someone who

- demonstrates a consistent Christ-like character
- is committed to the disciplines of personal prayer and Bible study
- is confident and able to work under pressure
- is able to prioritise a heavy workload
- is able to recruit, train and motivate volunteers
- is computer literate and willing to learn
- is fit and able to work as part of a busy team and be supportive to others when needed.
